### School Sleepover

On Thursday 13th February we will be hosting a School Sleepover. If children do not wish to stay over the full night there is the option to attend 6-9pm at half the price. **Sign up for the event will close on Monday at 10am.**

Children will need to bring a sleeping mat/inflatable mat, duvet or sleeping bag, pillow, pyjamas wash kit including toothbrush and toothpaste, uniform for the following day and a packed lunch (if not having School Dinner)



The arrangements for the evening are:

- Children will go home from school at **3.15pm** as normal.
- Children will need to have their **tea at home**
- At **6pm**, the children will come back into school for activities, a small evening snack, a movie and then bed.
- Children will be sleeping in the hall, and will be given breakfast in breakfast club on Friday morning
- Children will then attend a **normal day** in school, with a special art activity planned for the afternoon
- Children will be picked up from school at **3.15pm normal time** for the end of the half term.
